



## LOO NOIES

Tommy Smythe, senior designer at Sarah Richardson Design, created this handsome gentleman's retreat for his Toronto home.

## **DESIGN FEATURES**

- Distinctive marble tile flooring in a black and white basketweave pattern (suggested by Richardson) that sets a sophisticated tone.
- Matte black walls framed by glossy, white-tiled wainscotting — the pairing suggests a crisp tuxedo and imparts a masculine glamour.
- Repurposed antiques (the vanities, bamboo table and hall chair) that warm up the black and white palette.
- Panelling across the front of the tub, painted a glossy black for water resistance and a bit of shine.
- Vintage trophies, a black ponyskin stool and sepiatoned postcards to reinforce the room's clubby ambience.

OPPOSITE: The marble flooring set in a basketweave pattern determined the black and white palette and semiformal tone of this spacious bathroom. Antique postcards and a vintage trophy collection give it the feel of a gentleman's club. Postcards, Boj Decor; stool, HorseFeathersHome.

ABOVE: Tommy Smythe had this antique bow-front chest of drawers converted into a vanity topped with honed Carrara marble. The faucet's squared-off design is a suitably tailored accent.
